THE HEART SUTRA

(MAHA) PRAJNA PARAMITA HRIDAYA SUTRA

Avalokiteshvara Bodhisattva when practicing deeply the <u>Prajna</u> Paramita perceives that all five skandhas are empty and is <u>saved</u> from all suffering and distress.

<u>Shariputra</u>, form does not differ <u>from</u> emptiness, <u>emptiness</u> does not differ from form. That which is form is emptiness, that which is emptiness, form. The same is true <u>of</u> feelings, perceptions, impulses, consciousness.

<u>Shari</u>putra, all dharmas are marked <u>with</u> emptiness. <u>They</u> do not appear <u>or</u> disappear, are not tainted or pure, do not increase <u>or</u> decrease. <u>There</u>fore in emptiness, <u>no</u> form, no feelings, <u>per</u>ceptions, <u>impulses</u>, consciousness. <u>No</u> eyes, no ears, no nose, no tongue, <u>no</u> body, <u>no</u> mind; no color, <u>no</u> sound, no smell, no taste, no touch, <u>no</u> object of mind; no realm of eyes <u>and</u> so forth until no realm of mind-consciousness. <u>No</u> ignorance and also no extinction of it, <u>and</u> so forth until no old-age and death <u>and</u> also no extinction of them. <u>No</u> suffering, no origination, <u>no</u> stopping, no path, no cognition, <u>al</u>so no attainment, with nothing to attain.

The Bodhi<u>sat</u>tva depends on <u>Prajna Paramita</u> and mind is no hindrance, without any hindrance <u>no</u> fears exist. <u>Far</u> apart from every perverted view we dwell in Nirvana.

In the three worlds <u>all</u> Buddhas depend on <u>Prajna Paramita and attain Anuttara Samyak Sambodhi.</u>

<u>There</u>fore know that <u>Prajna</u> Paramita is the great transcendent mantra, is the great bright mantra, is the utmost mantra, is the supreme mantra, which is <u>able</u> to relieve <u>all</u> suffering and is true, not false. So proclaim the <u>Prajna</u> Paramita mantra, <u>pro</u>claim the mantra that says:
